

27 artefacts shifted to museum

KANAKOL, July 26: Some 27 of the 231 artefacts seized by the police in a raid last month — and some of them will be his belonging — on Gopinath Subrahmanyan — were shifted from the Sports Library public library to the National Museum on Sunday afternoon.
